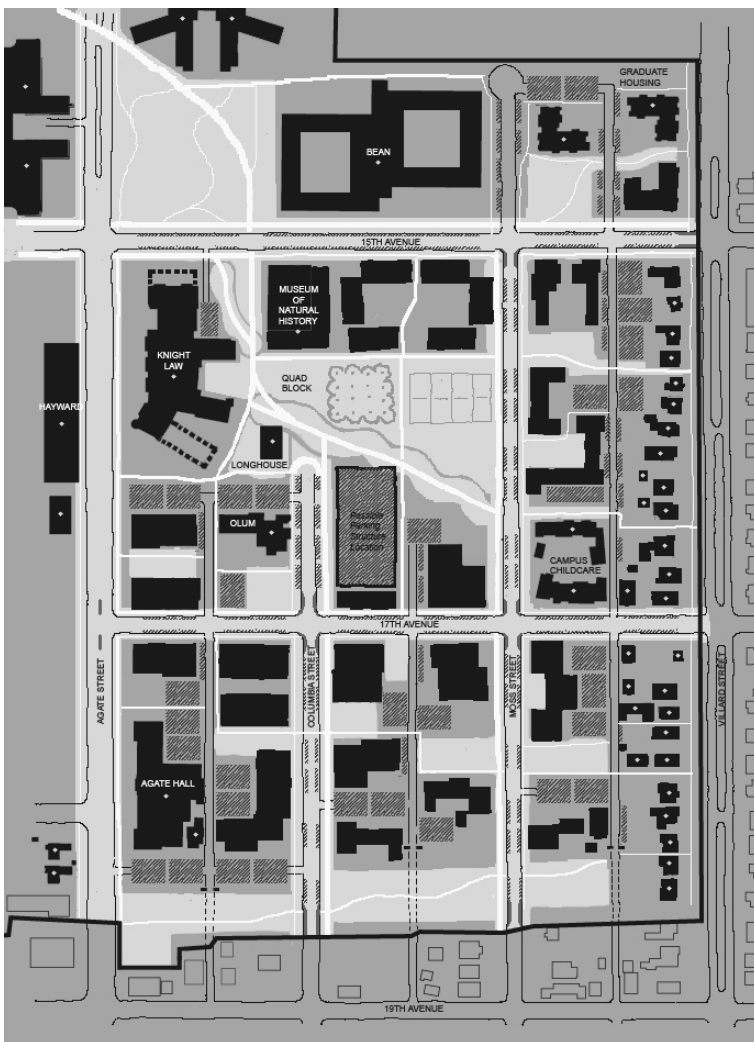
The East Campus Open Space Framework Study demonstrates Rowell Brokaw Architects' ability to translate the long-standing planning traditions of the University of Oregon into new and complex contexts. Working closely with Chris Ramey and Christine Thompson of the University Planning Office, Rowell Brokaw Architects developed a simulation tool and planning framework that examined possible scenarios for the expansion of the campus. It accounted for analytical standards while articulating a strong campus character through design guidelines.
